Rocket. 43 days. Unique spicy flavor. The traditional Italian salad. Long dark green leaves form loose bunch.

Wild Rocket. Improved and stronger flavor with lanceolated and serrated foliage.

Broccoli

70°F. 5-10 days. Cover seed.

CMS Liberty. 65 days. High quality, widely adapted variety. Dark green color. Heads are finely beaded. Excellent holding ability. Height: 26 in. **A**

Early Dividend. 45 days. Earliest maturing variety. Dark green color. Great secondary heads, 3-4 in. **B**

Premium Crop. 58 days. Large dark green firm and smooth with small beads.

Italian Green Sprouting. Vigorous, early type forming large compact central heads and very few laterals.

Ambrosia. 82 days. Fruits 4-4 1/2 lbs. are exceptionally sweet. Heavily netted but free of ribs. **E**

Fastbreak. 65 days. Early maturing and wonderful eating quality. Large yields of 3-4 lb. fruit. **F**

Honey Dew Green Flesh. 110 days. Classic Honeydew melon. Smooth skin, light green flesh, 4-4 1/2 lbs., round oval fruit.

Cauliflower

70°F. 5-10 days. Cover seed.

Brocoverde. 60-70 days. Green headed. Head size up to 1 lb. Contains twice as much Vitamin C and Folic Acid as either Broccoli or Cauliflower. **G**

Early Snowball. 52 days. 2 lb., white heads.

Snow Crown. 50 days. Early snowball type. Round smooth, 2 lb., pure white heads.

Stardust. 68 days. Self Blanche type. Snow white, 3-4 lbs. uniform heads. Very fine texture. **H**

Celery

70°F. 10-15 days. Cover seed.

Giant Pascal. 140 days. Popular green variety. Large creamy white heart.

Cucumber

72°F. 7-8 days. Cover seed.

Burpless Tasty Green. 60 days. Crisp and tasty, 9 in. dark green, not bitter. **J**

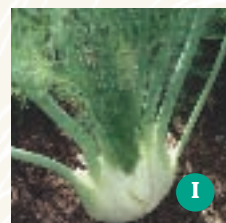
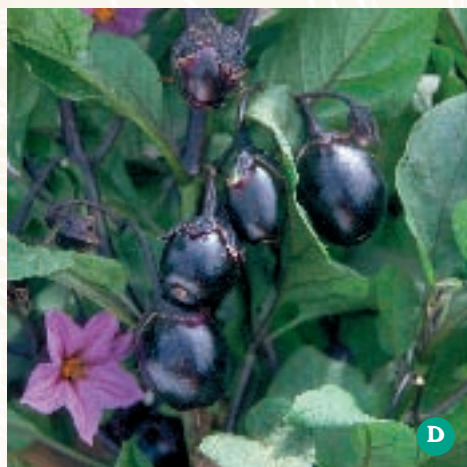
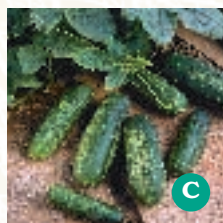
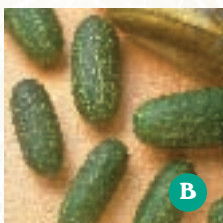
Diva. 58 days. AAS Winner. Smooth skinned semi-glossy and tender, 4 in. long. Non-bitter, sweet, crunchy, seedless and great as a snack. Gynoecious, increases yields. Tolerances: Scab, Powdery and Downey Mildew.

Fanfare. AAS Winner. 63 days. Disease tolerance. Includes; Downey Mildew, Powdery Mildew, Cucumber Mosaic Virus, Anthracnose, Angular Leaf Spot and Scab. Highly productive in limited spaces. Uniform green color, slim, 9 in. fruit. **K**

Slice Master Select. 55 days. Early, dark green, gynoecious. Heavy producer of top quality fruit. Very high disease resistance.

Spacemaster Bush. 60 days. 6-8 in. long fruit on dwarf bushy plants. Excellent for small gardens.

Sweet Slice. 62 days. Slim 10 in. long, dark green fruits are "burpless" and "bitter-free". Vigorous productive with disease resistance. **L**



Sweeter Yet. 48 days. Burpless, gynoecious, 10-12 in. Dark green fruits have thin, non-bitter skin. Resists Downey Mildew, Powdery Mildew, Cucumber Mosaic Virus, Zucchini Yellows Virus and Papaya Ring Spot. **A**

Pickling

Homemade Pickles. 56 days. Vigorous with high yield. Medium green with small white spines harvest from 1 1/2 in. for tiny sweets, to 5-6 in. for dill and spears. **B**

Patio Pickles. 49 days. Great for growing in containers or small gardens. Straight 4 in. long dark green pickles. Good disease resistance. **C**

Eggplant

70°-75° F, 7-14 days. Cover seed.

Bambino. 45 days. Ideal for garden and containers. Unique tiny 1 in. rich purple eggplants. Height: 12 in. **D**

Black Beauty. 72 days. Standard high quality, large fruited variety. Holds well.

Cloud Nine. 75 days. Pure white and bitter-free. Elongated oval fruits with a slight teardrop shape. Harvest when 7 in. long. The calyx is green. Resistant to TMV. Height: 4 ft. **E**

Dusky. 60 days. Very early, 8 in. dark purple elongated fruit. **F**

Green Goddess. 63 days. Long cylindrical shiny green fruits 8 1/2 in. x 2 in. across are almost non stop. **G**

Vittoria. 61 days. Mild 1/2 in. by 9 1/2 in. long fruit. Deep purple, with a contrasting green calyx. Fast growing. Height: 3 ft. **H**

Endive (Escarole)

70° F, 5-7 days.

Batavian. 85 days. Broad leaf type, wavy leaves with cut edges. Best variety for salads.

Herb

All are annuals unless noted.

Anise. Aromatic seeds used in flavoring. Height: 14-16 in.

Basil Dwarf Bouquet Spicy Globe. Aromatic leaves about 1/2 in. long. Height: 8-10 in.

Basil Large Leaf Italian. Leading general purpose Basil. Height: 1-2 ft.

Basil Lemon. Strong lemon fragrance.

Basil Magical Michael. AAS Winner. Ornamental use; pack and small pots. Very fragrant, but lower in oils than culinary basil. Green foliage with attractive purple tips and small creamy white flowers makes this item ideal as a foliage plant in combination containers. Height: 12-18 in.

Basil Purple Ruffles. AAS Winner. Glossy purple leaves, with unique texture and shape. Strong aromatic fragrance. Height: 18-24 in.

Basil Siam Queen. 45-50 days. AAS Winner. Thai-type different from European basil. Larger leaves. Thicker stems and late flowering, higher yields. Height: 28-39 in.

Basil Sweet Dani. AAS Winner. Strong lemon fragrance. Fusarium resistance.

Borage. Large, thick leaves are used as a pot herb. 12-16 in. tall.

Caraway. For flavoring breads, cheese, pastries. Height: 1 ft.

Chives. (Perennial) For flavoring and in borders. One of the most popular herbs. Height: 12-18 in.

Coriander or Cilantro. Grown for seed, known as Coriander. The foliage is called Cilantro. Used for flavoring in baking and confections. Height: 2-2 1/2 ft.

Dill Bouquet. Chiefly grown for seed clusters used in pickling. Very prolific. Height: 2-3 ft.

Dill Fernleaf. Ideal for containers, small gardens and ornamental flower beds. The ornamental flowers and foliage are excellent for cutting for indoor decorating. Height: 18 in.

Fennel Autumn Giant. Sow mid-July to mid-September. Harvest mid-October to mid-December. Produces huge white heads. **I**

Garlic Chives. (Perennial) Leaves are used for garlic flavoring. Height: 24-30 in.

Lemon Balm. (Perennial) Used for lemon flavoring and tea. Height: 12 in.

Oregano. (Perennial) Treated as annual. Leaves used in sauces, soups, etc. Height: 2-3 ft.

Peppermint (Perennial) Vigorous, low growing. Height: 6 in.

Rosemary. (Perennial) Blue flowers. Foliage used in seasoning. Height: 24-30 in.

Sage. (Perennial) For flavoring meat. Height: 2 ft.

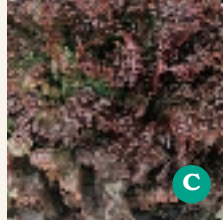

Stevia rebaudiana ^{NEW} Extremely sweet leaves. Used as natural sweetener in place of sugar. Height: 2 ft. **A**

Summer Savory. (Perennial) For seasoning and flavoring. Height: 12 in.

Sweet Marjoram. Tender young leaves used in seasoning. Height: 1-2 ft.

Thyme French Summer. (Perennial) Pungent flavor, used in culinary seasoning. Height: 12-18 in.

Kohlrabi
70°F. 10 days. Cover seed.

Grand Duke. 50-55 days. Ideal for field or under glass. Early, vigorous, uniform, semi-globe in shape. A truly fine hybrid.

Lettuce
70°F. 5-7 days. Cover seed.

Buttercrunch. 65 days. Butterhead/Bibb type, but large and more compact. Slower to bolt.

Grand Rapids. Looseleaf. Popular for home garden and forcing in greenhouse. Medium light green leaves, large and coarsely crumpled. Tip burn resistant.

Great Lakes. 90-100 days. Iceberg type.

Mesclun. 50-55 days. Well prepared mixture of salad leaves for cutting. The ingredients include: salad bowl, green and red, Lolla red and green, Giada, Rougette de Montpellier, Icequeen, Chicory Trieste, Spadona, Endive and Scarole and serrated Catalogna. **B**

Oakleaf. 55 days. Leaves shaped like oak tree leaves.

Red Sails. 55 days. Looseleaf. Bronze red savoyed or crinkled leaves. Plants average 12-15 in. across and a height of 6-8 in. **C**

Romaine. 83 days. Upright heads tightly folded about 10 in. tall. Medium green outer leaves with greenish white interior. Endive like flavor.

Salad Bowl. 45 days. Looseleaf. Slow-bolting variety for home garden. Light green, long and deeply notched leaves.

Okra
70°F. 7-14 days. Cover seed.

Cajun Delight. 50-55 days. AAS Winner. Attractive, dark green, tender pods and overall improved yield. Pods 3 1/2 to 5 in. Height: 24 in. **D**

Onion
70°F. 7-10 days. Cover seed.

Yellow Sweet Spanish Utah. 115 days. Large globe, skin dark yellow, flesh medium firm.

White Sweet Spanish Utah. 120 days. Late maturing. Large globe, white skin and flesh.

Parsley
70°F. 15-20 days. Cover seed.

Italian Plain Leaf. 75 days. Excellent for flavoring. Plant and leaf are very large, plain and dark green.

Moss Curled. 70 days. A medium green, double-curved type with excellent early branching. **E**

Pepper
70°-75°F. 7-10 days. Cover seed.

Hot

Anaheim TMR 23. 75-80 days. This TMR resistant strain produces longer thicker-fleshed pods which are slightly less pungent than Anaheim Chili. The fruit is pendant with continuous setting, and outstanding for smoothness and uniformity. Suitable for fresh market or processing. 7-8 in. long by 1 1/2 in. diameter. **F**

Cayenne Long Slim. 70 days. For pickles, canning and for drying. Fruits long, tapered, and very pungent.

Habanero. 95 days. One of the hottest varieties. Fruits are small about 1 1/2 in. x 1 in., wrinkled and taper to a point. Flesh is thin. Height: 24-26 in. **G**

Hungarian Yellow Wax. (Hot Banana). 65-68 days. Very early, long fruit. 5 1/2 x 1 1/2 in. tapered, waxy, light yellow.

Jalapeno M. 72-75 days. Compact plants produce fruit 3 x 1 1/2 in. Green to red.

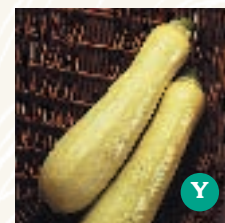
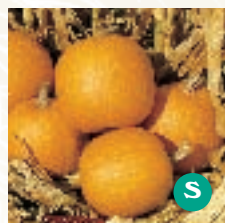
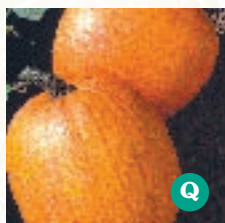
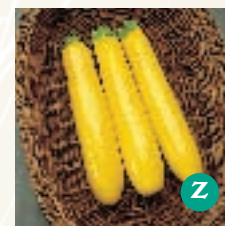
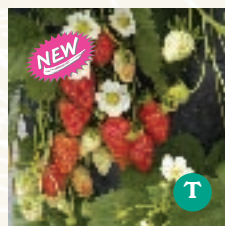
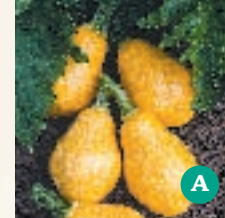
Kung Pao. 85 days. Thin walled 4 1/2 in. x 3/8 in wide, green to red Thai type peppers. High heat. **H**

Red Cherry Large. 80 days. Round, thick-walled fruits 1-1 1/2 in. For pickling.

Serrano Del Sol. 64-67 days. Strong disease resistance. 3 x 1/2 in. fruit. Medium thick walls. Height: 30 in. **I**

Spanish Spice. 65 days. Not hot, not sweet, just spicy. Green to red 7 x 1 3/4 in. tapered fruit. **J**

TAM Jalapeno #1. 70-75 days. Milder than Jalapeno M. Very mild flavor.

Bell Boy. 70 days. Green to red 4 1/2 x 3 1/2 in. fruit. Early, high yielding, high quality Bell for fresh market and home garden. Thick walls. TMR. **(K)**

Big Bertha. 70-73 days. Extremely large. Green to red 7 x 4 in., 3-4 lobed.

Blushing Beauty. 72-75 days. AAS Winner. Ivory to red, 4 x 4 in. thick walled. Tolerates Tobacco Mosaic Virus and three races of bacterial leaf spot. **(L)**

Cal Bell 19. 68 days. Large three lobed thick walled fruit. A very uniform and heavy producer.

California Wonder 300. 73-75 days. Large green to red 4 x 4 in.

Cherry Sweet. 75-80 days. Round fruits 1-1 1/2 in. For relish tray or pickling.

Corno Verde. 76 days. Looks like a chile but perfectly sweet. Very smooth, 9 in. thick walled fruit, 3 celled. Perfect for salads, roasting or grilling.

Cubanelle. 65 days. Medium thick, waxy. Green to red. Distinctly flavored, sweet frying pepper. **(M)**

Giant Marconi. 72 days. AAS Winner. Use for grilling, roasting, frying, salads, salsa, hot dishes. Large green to red 8 x 3 in. tapered fruit. Resists TMV, Potato Y. Height: 30 in. **(N)**

Golden California Wonder. 75 days. Large 4 x 4 in. golden yellow blocky bell. For stuffing.

Gypsy. 60-65 days. Gold to red 5 x 3 in., wedged shaped. Suitable for salads and frying. TMV tolerant. **(O)**

Italian Roaster. 70 days. Long dark green fruits, 9 x 3/4 in. Great for the grill. **(P)**

Keystone Giant #3. 75-80 days. Very thick, 4 1/2 x 4 in., blocky, 4 lobed fruits dark green to red. TMR resistance.

Purple Beauty. 70 days. Blocky, 4 x 3 1/2 in. Thick-walled green to dark purple.

Red Beauty. 68 days. Large, 4 x 3 1/2 in., thick walled, mostly four lobed green to red. TMR resistant.

Sweet Banana. (Sweet Hungarian). 65 days. 6 x 2 in. Yellow to red.

Sweet Havana. 63 days. 5 x 2 in. Early Cubanelle type. Light green.

72°F. 7 days. Cover seed.

Appalachian. 100 days. Jack O' Lantern. 18-25 lbs. Semi-bush vines with limited runners. **(Q)**

Autumn Gold. 90 days. Vines 12-20 ft. long, 7-10 lbs.

Big Moon. 120 days. A true pumpkin up to 200 lbs., heavily ribbed. Rich orange fruits on big vines. **(R)**

Jack-Be-Little. 95 days. Miniature Jack O' Lanterns. only about 3 x 2 in.

Spirit. 98 days. Semi bush spreads 6 ft. Average 12 in., 9-10 lbs. **(S)**

(Chicory)
70°-75°F. 10-21 days.

Rouge de Verone. 85 days. Attractive red-green apple size heads. Harvest early fall.

Strawberry

65°F. 21-28 days. Cover seed.

ABZ Series **(NEW)**

Great in hanging baskets and mixed containers. Roman, with its pink flowers and delicious large fruit. Beltran and Loran display white flowers followed by the large, red, sweet berries. Not day length responsive, so can extend the strawberry season past the June-bearing varieties, sell with the other summer vegetables. Supply fresh strawberries locally in October and November by growing Beltran in those empty summer houses. In FL, CA, AZ can plant out in the fall for a late winter/early spring harvest.

Loran. Big fruit, compact plants. **(U)**

Fancycrook. 43 days. Crookneck. Golden yellow. Powdery Mildew tolerance. **(X)**

Goldbar. 43 days. Golden yellow straightneck. Cylindrical, uniform and smooth. **(Y)**

Gold Rush. 52 days. Gold Zucchini straight and uniform. **(Z)**

Papaya Pear. 42 days. AAS Winner. Bright yellow, pear shaped fruits harvest at 3 1/2 by 2 1/2 in. Semi-bush habit, high yields. **(A)**

Early Butternut. 85 days. Gold, 10-12 in. smooth fruit. **E**

Pasta. 110 days. Spaghetti. Creamy yellow skin. Fruits 12 x 7 in. **F**

Sunshine. 80 days. AAS Winner. Kabocha type sweet, nutty flavor. Orange-red 4 lb. fruit short vines, only 6-8 feet. **G**

Table Ace. 78 days. Acorn. Semi-bush, dark black-green skin with delicious bright orange flesh. **H**
